
A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT: From WA3CPO, Gary Blacksmith, MD

POSSIBLE EXPANSIONS OF OUR SYSTEM:

ELIZABETHVILLE

A request has been by the hams from the Elizabethville group to extend the 5 GHz microwave from Blue Mtn to Elizabethville. This would provide full time linking from Upper Dauphin County to Lower Dauphin County. All other features of the network would be available also.

STEELTON

A request has been received from the Steelton EOC to join the network via the Reeser's Summit Access Point.

RED LION

A request has been received from the Red Lion area to join the network via the Red Lion relay point.

BIG FLAT

A request has been received by the hams at the Big Flat Amateur Group to join the network via Waggoner's Gap

ELECTIONS:

Elections have been postponed until May 17 to allow adequate time for ballots to be mailed to members and returned before or at the May meeting. And don't forget to renew your membership!

WORK PARTY:

A work party was formed to complete the outdoor grounding of all coaxial cables at Blue Mtn on Saturday April 14 the bus bar was badly oxidized. This required grinding of the copper bar to expose a freshly cleaned surface. New bolts clamped the wires to the bar and an oxidant retardant was applied to the wiring. New grounding clamp kits were used on the 7/8" coaxial cables. The lines were shaped to enter the building with a smooth bend. Excess wires were removed and entrance caps were sealed to prevent entrance by stink bugs. Coaxial lightning arrestors are used on the inside of the building. Grounding is now the best that we have ever had.

PEMA AND OTHER LOCAL NETS AND FREQUENCIES:

Central Area Net meets on 3993.5 KHz every Sunday at 8:30 AM Local. Central Area PEMA frequencies are: 3993.5 KHz - Primary, Alternates: 3984.5 KHz, 3999.5 KHz, 7248.5 KHz, and 7250.5 KHz The Eastern Area meets on 3987.5 KHz every Sunday morning at 9:00 AM Local. The Western Area meets on 3990.5 KHz every Sunday morning at 9:00 AM Local. Our PA State Net meets the FIRST SUNDAY of every month on 3993.5 kHz at 8:00 AM Local. This net is usually called by John Kruk, K3KR, Lock Haven; at which time he calls Eastern, Central and Western Area Stations in that order. The New York State net usually meets on 3993.5 kHz at 9:00 AM right after our Central Area net.

The weekly Harrisburg Amateur Radio Club Information Net is held every Wednesday at 8:00 PM local on the 146.76 HRAC repeater, except for the second Wednesday of the month which is

club meeting night, **and the Capital Area Skywarn Net** meets Wednesday evenings at 9:00 PM local on the 145.11 RACES repeater. All are welcome to check in.

ON-LINE OPERATOR TRAINING COURSE AVAILABILITY:

NIMS (**National Incident Management System**) courses, including ICS 100, 200 and 700 certification are available on-line. They discuss <u>emergency management is organization</u> and how volunteers such as us fit in to the process. The Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Course Levels 1 and 2, available from the ARRL, cover <u>Amateur Radio emergency operating procedures</u>. The June 2011 issue of QST Magazine (pages 80 and 81) provides an excellent introductory article on the NIMS. Page 79 of the March 2012 issue of QST contains further information on training and certification of ARES operators.

ANOTHER REMINDER ABOUT 5 MHZ BAND OPERATIONS:

In the USA, the 5MHz channels were requested, justified, and approved primarily for Amateur Emergency and Disaster Communications with tighter technical restrictions than on any other ham bands. We are secondary users; the Primary users of these channels must not be interfered with in any way. Non-interference with a Primary user isn't just a matter of stopping transmitting if you are asked to. It can also mean refraining from transmitting, if there is *any chance* that you might be preventing a Primary user from utilizing or starting communications on the channel, even if you are not asked specifically. The only way we can hope to fulfill our requirement for non-interference, is to use very short transmissions and listen/watch carefully between transmissions.

TASK FORCE FORMS TEAMS:

The Amateur Working Group for the South Central Task Force is forming teams to be on standby to be deployed to incidents out of our area. Members with ICS training and specified equipment are being assigned to teams to provide emergency communications for a minimum of 12 hours in a disaster. HEARS teams are also being formed to be able to be assigned to hospitals within our region to provide emergency communications support. ICS training is required to be assigned to these teams.
