UHF REPEATER-444.45

This repeater is out of service and will be returned as soon as it is relocated from a standalone short cabinet to a special in rack mounting system. It has been upgraded for linking with the Cornwall UHF repeater and the Reeser's Summit UHF repeater.

Inappropriate language has resurfaced. We will discuss this further at the next meeting. It just keeps working

BLUE MOUNTAIN

Four huge racks with front and rear doors are operational. A 5 GHz link between Blue Mountain and Cornwall mountain & Reeser's Summit has been reliable. The microwave dishes have been replaced with high performance dishes. The 5 GHz link to PEMA provides a connection for telephone, fax, and emergency internet. PEMA has agreed to host a wireless internet service provider for us. The monthly charge and the equipment have all been donated. Cisco routers will be used to carry the audio between repeaters.

REESER'S SUMMIT

The antennas will be mounted as soon as climbers are available. APRS and UHF are operating with low temporary antennas. The high powered six meter base station is on site. A 5 GHz link between White Rock and Reeser's Summit has been reliable with a throughput of 300/300 Mbps including overhead. White Rock will support the six meter receive equipment since the noise is the lowest in the area. A 5 GHz link between Blue Mountain and Reeser's Summit has also been reliable with a throughput of 300/300 Mbps including overhead. Cisco routers will carry the audio interconnections.

CORNWALL MOUNTAIN

This location provides UHF coverage into Lebanon and Lancaster counties. A 5 GHz link between Cornwall Mountain and Blue Mountain has been reliable with a throughput of 150/150 Mbps including overhead over a 26 mile path. A 5 GHz link between Cornwall Mountain and SPARC is operational.

PEMA AND OTHER LOCAL NETS AND FREQUENCIES:

Central Area meets on 3993.5 KHz every Sunday at 8:30 AM Local Eastern Area meets on 3987.5 KHz every Sunday morning at 9:00 AM Local Western Area meets on 3990.5 KHz every Sunday morning at 9:00 AM Local

Our PA State Net meets the FIRST SUNDAY of every month on 3993.5 kHz at 8:00 AM Local. This net is usually called by John Kruk, K3KR, Lock Haven; at which time he calls Eastern, Central and Western Area Stations in that order. The New York State net usually meets on 3993.5 kHz at 9:00 AM right after our Central Area net. Central Area PEMA frequencies are:

3993.5 KHz - Primary, Alternates 3984.5 KHz, 3999.5 KHz, 7248.5 KHz, 7250.5 KHz

The weekly Harrisburg Amateur Radio Club Information Net is held every Wednesday at 8:00 PM local on the 146.76 HRAC repeater, except for the second Wednesday of the month which is club meeting night, and the Capital Area Skywarn Net Wednesday evenings at 9:00 PM local on the 145.11 RACES repeater. All are welcome to check in.

ON-LINE OPERATOR TRAINING COURSE AVAILABILITY:

You <u>should</u> take the FEMA and ARRL training courses. The following link will bring you <u>www.training.fema.gov/EMIWeb/IS/crslist.asp</u> to FEMA stuff you might be interested in...PEMA also offers many of the same courses. The Emergency Management Institute (EMI) also offers NIMS related training.

The NIMS (**National Incident Management System**) courses show <u>how emergency management is organized</u> and how volunteers such as us fit in to the process. Available training includes the ICS 100, 200 and 700 certification courses which can be completed in a day or less each on-line. These are recommended for both ARES and RACES operators. The Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Course Levels 1 and 2, available from the **ARRL**, cover <u>Amateur Radio emergency operating procedures</u>.

While you don't have to get all this stuff at once, it is a good idea to be working on it now so you will have later when you need it. And...listen to how the nets operate, then join in...good practice.
